## STRUCTURE OF THE COURSE

Welcome to the **B.1.2.1** level of General English at Zion International Language School. This level will focus exclusively on listening comprehension and the continued development of oral and written expression.

## **METHODOLOGY**

Live Practice Sessions and videotaped content. This course is divided into modules and each module has practice and content lessons. Students independently view the video content before coming to the Live Practice Sessions. During the real-time practice sessions with an instructor, who monitors and evaluates students' work and projects, students engage in conversations in English and practice workbooks in English. Each lesson has its own study material that includes videos, prerecorded, e-books and supplementary reading.



## Main goal:

- The main objective of this level is for the student:
  - to continue developing oral expression in English,
  - to be able to express their ideas,
  - to other interlocutors, at the same time as reading and writing skills in this language, thus reinforcing the Upper Intermediate level of the course.

### **Evaluation:**

 At the end of modules 1,2 and 4 you will find a Listening and Reading Comprehension Test. Also, there is a comprehensive test at the end of Module 5. Student number score will translate into a number and letter grade for the course. Student will snap shot a picture of their score and email it to the instructor upon due dates.

#### **COURSE GRADING**

In this course, students are graded on their comprehension test of English, and their practice ability to apply English through listening, speaking, reading and writing. This course syllabus focuses on the students' grading the live online portion of the English B1.2.1.2.3 courses, in accordance with the Zion International University grading policy.
